#### 1. CALL TO ORDER AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA

President Jim Hill was not able to attend the meeting. Vice President Shawn Hodgson, who volunteered to act on Jim's behalf, called the meeting to order. The agenda was adopted.

Shawn welcomed the attendees to the meeting and asked them to introduce themselves.

#### 2. REVIEW OF MINUTES

The minutes of the 2019 Annual Meeting of Members were reviewed.

**MOTION M-20-01:** BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Minutes of the 2019 Annual Meeting of Members dated February 28, 2019 be approved as circulated.

#### 3. REVIEW OF 2019 ACTIVITIES

Shawn reviewed the President's Report which was included in the package presented to those present at the meeting. He drew attention to the documents that were attached to the report, which were the Awards Lists from 2018 and 2019, as well as the Donation Trends and Awards sheet beginning in 1999, the Educational Foundation Financial Report ending December 2019, the CPA letter and the Board of Directors' List. He noted that most of the awards are valued at \$1250 and named awards are \$1500.

Maureen spoke about the Donation Trends and Awards sheet and noted that donations in 2019 decreased, however the amount of the yearly awards has increased. The capital has dropped slightly this year, but still remains above \$400,000. There is a possibility that \$50,750 could be awarded in 2019 if all awards are presented. Since 1975, 99 foundation award winners have become Ontario Land Surveyors (this is rising rapidly) and 19 of our current articling students are award winners.

#### 4. 2019 FINANCIAL REPORTS

Maureen presented a summary of the 2019 Financial Statements ending December 31, 2019. The following motion was presented.

The next item on the agenda was a motion regarding necessity of an audit. An audit is not required under the Corporations Act, R.S.O. 1990 if the annual income of the charity is less than \$100,000 and the members consent. However at the annual meeting in 2016, it was recorded that Maureen be directed to find a qualified individual to come to the office and complete an informal review of the books and the accounting procedures. Bob Pomeroy contacted Ray MacKenzie, a Chartered Professional Accountant (CPA), who came into the AOLS office on May 27, 2016 to review the Educational Foundation records and files and the accounting procedures. He found everything to be in good order and sent a letter of assurance to the Board of Directors. A copy of the letter, dated June 6, 2016, which was received and filed with the minutes of the 2016 meeting, is included in the package.

Maureen noted that there are not a lot of large expenses incurred by the Foundation as her salary is covered by the AOLS and Bookkeeper Bob Pomeroy is paid an hourly rate for his time. It is very easy to see where expenses occur and she keeps a photocopy of every donation cheque coming in and awards cheque going out. After no further discussion, a motion was brought forth.

representative. The time commitment is not onerous as there are not that many meetings scheduled throughout the year. Rodney Geyer expressed interest as the Chair of the Georgian Bay Regional Group to join the Board of Directors.

The Directors for 2020-2021 will be confirmed at the next Board of Directors Meeting. They will include: Jim Hill, Shawn Hodgson, Boney Cherian, Kevin Smith, Brian Coad, Amar Loai and Rodney Geyer. New ex-officio officers will be the immediate AOLS Past President Al Jeraj, and not confirmed at this time, the AOLS Finance Councillor.

#### 6. 2020 AGM EVENTS SUMMARY

The Exhibitors' Draw at the Welcoming Party was again a success. Even though the number of attendees seemed smaller, a total amount of \$3435 was collected from the ticket sales during the evening. We thank Lena Kassabian, Julia Savitch, Penny Anderson, Mel Truchon and Darren Walker for selling tickets and Bill Webb for acting as the Master of Ceremonies. We should also thank the Exhibitors for their draw prizes.

Maureen reported that 15 posters were judged in the Graduate Student Poster Competition and the top 5 posters will be identified with ribbons after this meeting this morning. Thanks to our judges: Boney Cherian, Reuben Mc Rae and Brian Coad.

#### 7. OPEN FORUM

Shawn thanked the Board members for their work and Maureen for all that she does for the Foundation. Amar mentioned that he attended the Ryerson Civil Engineering Awards in November and he expressed how impressed he was with the number of awards that the Foundation provides to Ryerson's Civil Engineering students. There is a rumour that the Engineering Department might reinstate the Geomatics Option and Amar feels it is in part due to the Foundation's tremendous support. Hugh said that the Eastern Regional Group is trying to raise funds to support an award for a student who is becoming an Ontario Land Surveyor. Our guest from Fleming College was Marikka Williams. She suggested that some of her students would be well suited to pursuing a career in land surveying. She had invited Peter Hettstedt from J.D. Barnes Limited to come and speak to her students about careers and job opportunities and he was well received. With the shortage in technical staff, Fleming may be a good source for our employers.

#### 8. NEW BUSINESS

Maureen reported that she had been contacted by the Kawartha-Haliburton Regional Group Chair, Morgan Goadsby. He advised her that the group will be increasing their yearly donation to the foundation to \$750 and they would like to increase their scholastic award at Fleming College from \$1250 to \$1500. This year they will name the award in honour of John Stuart Duncan, who recently passed away. Maureen will prepare a motion for the increase for the next Board of Directors meeting.

#### 9. ADJOURNMENT

Shawn Hodgson thanked the Board of Directors, the Regional Group Chairs and other representatives and guests for attending the meeting and for their support and participation.

The meeting was adjourned. The next Board of Directors' meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 19, 2020 at 10:00 a.m. at the AOLS office and by teleconference.

I thank them and Bob Pomeroy, our Foundation Bookkeeper.

At the suggestion of some members, a new Letters Patent will become available (when approved by Foundation members and following Canada and Ontario regulatory approvals). This will enable the Foundation to provide awards, in addition to ones previously in place, to professional and technical geomatics students across Canada. Criteria will have to be established for all awards and contracts made with the educational institutes. I thank those who have helped with this process.

Donations from members, corporations, the Exhibitors' Draw and income from interest have allowed the Foundation to raise \$35,766 in 2020. Our goal was \$35,000. The capital fund is \$421,964 which will be used to fulfill our commitment of \$51,500 for 2020 awards.

The Awards, their dollar value, their sponsors and the Institutes are shown on the attached chart. Also attached is the chart showing "Donation Trends and Award Totals 2020".

Since 1975 over \$581,650 has been awarded to more than 497 students (some have been multiple award winners), 103 of whom have become Ontario Land Surveyors and 14 are presently articling students.

A donation to the Foundation, of any size, is a fine way to commemorate the life of a friend. Those who were remembered by memorial donations in 2020 were, Henriette Verhoef, Fernando

De Luca, Larry Monaghan, Norm Babbs, Bob Garden, Bob McCurdy, John Goltz, John Boyd and Mike Clancy.

The Foundation also gratefully accepts and acknowledges bequests from estates.

The 2020 Graduate Student Poster Session attracted 15 entries and \$6,250 was awarded to 7 students. The winning posters were featured in the Spring 2020 issue of the Ontario Professional Surveyor magazine.

I thank the members, companies, and Regional Groups for their continuing support for the awards that are made possible by their donations. These awards will continue to play a significant role in attracting promising students to our profession.
