MINUTES OF THE 2022 ANNUAL MEETING OF MEMBERS

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Vice President Trevor McNeil took on the role as moderator because President Jim Hill was on the phone. Trevor called the Annual General Meeting for 2022 to order. He asked for a motion to approve the agenda.

MOVED: Dave Kovacs SECONDED: Rodney Geyer CARRIED

2. REVIEW OF MINUTES

The minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting of Members were reviewed. Trevor asked if there were any comments or input regarding the minutes. There were none, therefore he called for someone make a motion to adopt the minutes:

MOTION M-22-01: BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting of Members dated February 25, 2021 be approved as circulated.

MOVED: Jim Hill SECONDED: Brian Coad CARRIED

3. REVIEW OF 2021 ACTIVITIES

Jim Hill was asked to comment on his 2021 President's Report, which was included in the Educational Foundation Annual General Meeting package. He thanked Trevor for chairing the meeting. Jim said that his term as Past President will begin at the Board of Directors' meeting in March and the Board will be electing a new President. He said that "Our profession and the Foundation are facing challenges, but I am confident that both the profession and the Foundation will flourish." He said that "Our new revised patent will add to the Foundation's relevance and our ability to assist students." He was thinking about the Foundation's founders: Jack Barnes, Jim Deardon, Red Petzold and George Yates, and said that "I think they would be proud and maybe even surprised at what you have accomplished, starting with \$5000 in 1975 and as we will see in the financial report it is considerably larger than that." He thanked everyone for their support for the Foundation and wished everyone to keep safe, be well and keep smiling.

Trevor thanked Jim. Maureen was asked to comment on the awards. She said that she had included lists of both the 2020 and 2021 awards (2021 awards were not complete yet). She noted that on the awards list, York University was "pretty bare" because enrollment had been stopped for the third year in a row and because of that we are not giving out all the awards that have been allocated. She said the Board will review the terms of the York contract at the next Board meeting.

The trends sheet was reviewed. Trevor noted that the donations had increased for 2021 in spite of the pandemic and said it was good that members are still thinking of the Educational Foundation and still contributing during these times. Maureen was asked if she thought that donations were falling behind the amount of awards presented. Maureen said that when she took over the Foundation [in the year 2000] there weren't many awards presented. She followed Bookkeeper, Bob Pomeroy's advice that if we started to give out more awards we would attract more donations. So that is what we did. And also with a large capital fund, we don't want to be sitting on money if we can be donating it to students. People are seeing that the awards are making a difference. Five of the new OLSs since the last convocation are award winners, and as Jim mentions in his President's report, 16 of our articling students are award winners and now we are up to 108 in total of OLSs who have received awards. People are seeing that the awards are making a difference and perhaps that is why the donations are climbing a little bit.

4. 2021 FINANCIAL REPORTS

The 2021 Financial Statements ending December 31, 2021 were reviewed. Trevor asked if anyone had questions or concerns regarding the financial statements. Hearing none, he called for motion to accept the financial statements.

MOTION M-22-02: BE IT RESOLVED THAT the 2021 Financial Reports be accepted.

MOVED: Paul Miller SECONDED: Brian Coad CARRIED

The next item on the agenda was a motion regarding the necessity of an audit. Trevor noted that because the foundation's donation income is under the \$100,000 threshold, an audit is not required. We did have an accounting firm look at the books and Ray MacKenzie reported in a letter that there was nothing that brought him any concern. Trevor said that there was no need for an audit at this time, but this might change with the

new rules [under the new Not for Profit Corporations Act]. We may possibly revisit the need once the Foundation falls under the new Act.

There were no more questions therefore Trevor read the following motion.

MOTION M-22-03: WHEREAS an audit is not required under the Corporations Act, R.S.O. 1990 if the annual income of the charity is less than \$100,000 and the members consent.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT the requirement for an audit be waived and will only be brought forward at a future meeting when deemed necessary.

MOVED: Brian Coad SECONDED: Paul Miller CARRIED

5. NOMINATIONS FOR THE 2022 – 2023 BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Trevor asked if anyone who was at the meeting, but not on the Board, would like to join the Board or if they had heard of anyone that would like to join our Board. Maureen suggested that it would be good to have more representation from regional groups. Boney agreed that it would be beneficial to have at least one member from every regional group to represent us at meetings. Maureen also mentioned that they could perhaps sponsor a college in their area as well. Rodney reported that the GBRG is looking to support an award for the survey component in the Civil Engineering program at Georgian College. Trevor noted that not many Regional Group Chairs had joined the meeting. Jim reminded the members that our Patent says that we shall have four directors, two which shall be exofficio, but what we have done in the past has been to take on more directors than the four and he thinks that it has been a good idea. He doesn't think that we need to try to have a director from every regional group but have some type of communication with each regional group. This will be discussed at the next meeting.

6. REPORT ON SUPPLEMENTARY LETTERS PATENT

Trevor said that he checked with the lawyer who is looking after our request for Supplementary Letters Patent a few weeks ago and they still haven't heard anything back from the government. The lawyer has made some inquiries but hasn't received a response. He was surprised that we hadn't heard anything yet and thought we should have heard something by now but everything has slowed down to COVID.

7. 2021 AGM DONATION FROM AOLS – POSTER SESSION

Trevor reported that the AOLS is again donating \$3000 from the AGM registration in lieu of our Exhibitor Fundraiser and extended a big thank you to the AGM Planning Committee for that.

The Graduate Student Poster Session attracted 11 posters, 2 from Ryerson University and 9 from York University. Our judges are Brian Coad, Rueben Mc Rae and Boney Cherian. The poster pdfs are to be loaded onto the virtual platform and the results will be announced during the Friday morning session at the AGM.

8. OPEN FORUM

Trevor asked if there was anything to be brought up during the open forum for discussion. Brian Maloney said that he thought that we should not use the same process for access to the Zoom link to the meeting next time considering the poor attendance.

Because the members were forced to use the Members' side of the website to retrieve the meeting link, he felt that it was hidden in the portal and may have introduced a barrier. Trevor mentioned that also last year, there was the topic of changing the letters patent which probably drew more interest. Maureen suggested that she could prepare a summary of the minutes and send it out via In Sight with a link to a summary so that people who didn't attend at least know about some of the awards we are giving out and the amount of money we are bringing in.

9. NEW BUSINESS

Trevor McNeil said that he was sad that Jim Hill was stepping down as President after this meeting. Jim has been President for 20 years and a Board member for much longer than that, but he is going to stay on as Past President, so we are lucky that we are not losing him that way. He wanted to say a big thank you to Jim for all his work and efforts for the many years that he has been on this Board. Trevor said he has served this Board very well, thank you Jim.

Maureen said she would like to follow up with that with giving Jim a presentation. As Jim announced in his report, he is stepping down as the President of the Educational Foundation. And as Trevor said, some of you may not know this, but Jim has been the President for 20 years. He took on the role in February 2002 and for many years prior to that he was a Director on the Board. Jim has tirelessly supported the Foundation in its efforts to attract geomatics students to our association and he will continue on as a member of the Board as Past President. Jim has also been volunteering for many years with the Archival and Historical Committee. In 2009, he was presented with a Centenary Award for his exemplary conduct and accomplishments. When Council heard that Jim was stepping down as the President of the Foundation, they wanted to further acknowledge his outstanding volunteer service with a citation. This will be formally presented at the Convocation Lunch next week. I would also like to acknowledge Jim's Citation here today. The citation reads as follows:

The President and Council of the Association of Ontario Land Surveyors present this citation to Jim Hill in recognition of many years of devoted service in furthering the profession of surveying and the betterment of this association.

Congratulations Jim, it has been a pleasure working with you over these 20 years and we thank you for serving as President. Thanks Jim. The Board members extended their thanks to Jim.

Jim thanked everyone and Maureen and then said that he would like to say a few words. He said that he had stumbled into land surveying in the summer of 1954 and has enjoyed most of it. The profession and the people have been good to him. He also added that he had stumbled into a hotel room in 1999 or 2000 where the Foundation was having its AGM and Cindy Kliaman was the President and she worked at the same place as he did and the reason that he went was just to support her. It turned out that everybody at the AGM, somewhat like today, was a Board member and as soon as he sat down, he became a Board member as well and he has enjoyed it. He thanked everyone and said to keep up

the good work. He thanked Trevor for chairing the meeting and told everybody to stay safe.

Trevor thanked Jim and said it has been an honour serving with him as President of this Board.

10. ADJOURNMENT

Trevor said there was nothing else and that the agenda had been completed. The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, March 10, 2022 at 10:00 a.m. which will be a Zoom meeting. And with that, the meeting was adjourned, and everyone expressed their thanks.

I am pleased to present this report to the members at our 2023 virtual Annual General Meeting.

After my first full year of serving as the President of the Educational Foundation, I must again acknowledge the road map that Jim Hill, Maureen Mountjoy and others have laid before us. Their continued support by staying on the Board Directors and their leadership as part of our Board is greatly appreciated. The Educational Foundation is very fortunate to have people like them who have the dedication and commitment to provide awards to the students of this profession. As a special note the Board of Directors would also like to give a heartfelt thank you to all the work Bob Pomeroy does as the Foundation's Bookkeeper, he is one of those people who are seldom seen but has a huge impact on how our finances are handled.

Secretary/Chief Administrative Officer

The revised Letters Patent which will allow the Foundation to give awards outside of Ontario was approved by the members in 2021 and an application for Supplementary Letters Patent was sent by the Foundation's lawyer to the Ontario Government for its approval. After much back and forth with the Foundation's lawyer and the Government, we have just recently received our revised Letters Patent. We will now be able to move ahead with researching opportunities to set up awards with post-secondary educational institutions outside of Ontario but still within Canada. We look forward to the potential future partnership opportunities with the various colleges and universities that offer geomatics/surveying courses and programs in Canada.

Donations from members, corporations, the AOLS and interest income have allowed the Foundation to raise \$39,294.94 in 2022. The financial statement is attached.

Also attached are the 2021 and 2022 awards charts and the chart showing "Donation Trends and Award Totals" from 1999 to 2022. You will notice that awards to students at York have declined significantly since enrolment into the Geomatics Engineering program was stopped 3 years ago.

Since 1975 over \$680,000 has been awarded to more than 550 students (some have been multiple award winners), 114 of whom have become Ontario Land Surveyors and 14 are presently articling students.

A memorial donation in 2022 was made in honour of William Blackie.

The 2022 Graduate Student Poster Session attracted 11 entries and \$8,000 was awarded to 7 students. The winning posters were featured in the Spring 2022 issue of the Ontario Professional Surveyor magazine. It was decided at the Board of Directors' meeting in November that since none of the poster winners were pursing memberships in the AOLS, that the Poster Session would not be continued, and the funds would be directed to other awards.

The Educational Foundation would like to thank the AOLS for allowing our Student Poster Competitions to take place and be part of the Annual General Meeting over the past number of years. We would also like to thank the various people who have acted as Judges of the Posters in past years. We know it was not an easy job to grade some of the great work and effort that was put forward. Of course, the Foundation would not be anywhere without the diligent and continuous work of Maureen Mountjoy on so many levels.
