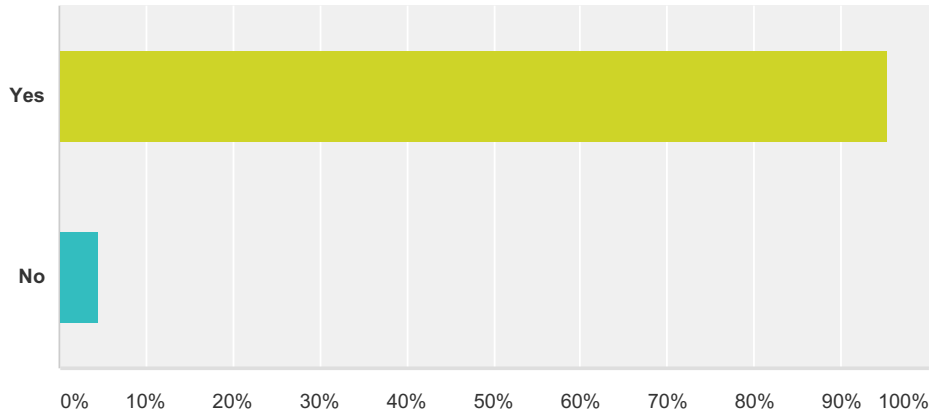


### Q1 Do you feel the webinar engaged you?
