





### Q3 How would you rate the hotel rooms and service?



### Q4 How would you rate the conference facilities for the meeting?







### Q8 Did you have enough time to visit the exhibits?



### Q9 Were the lengths of the sessions appropriate?







### Q13 How would you rate the presentation "Canada's RADARSAT Constellation Mission: Opportunities for Monitoring"? (Wednesday afternoon)













## Q26 How would you rate the Welcoming Party?



## Q27 How would you rate the Veterans' Celebration Dinner?


