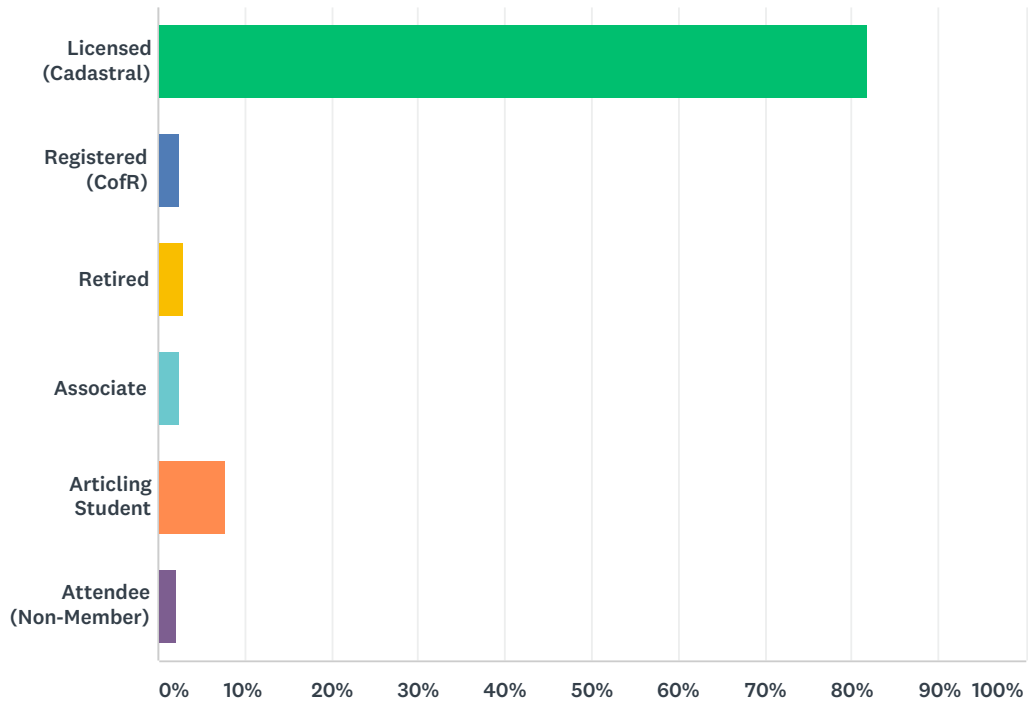

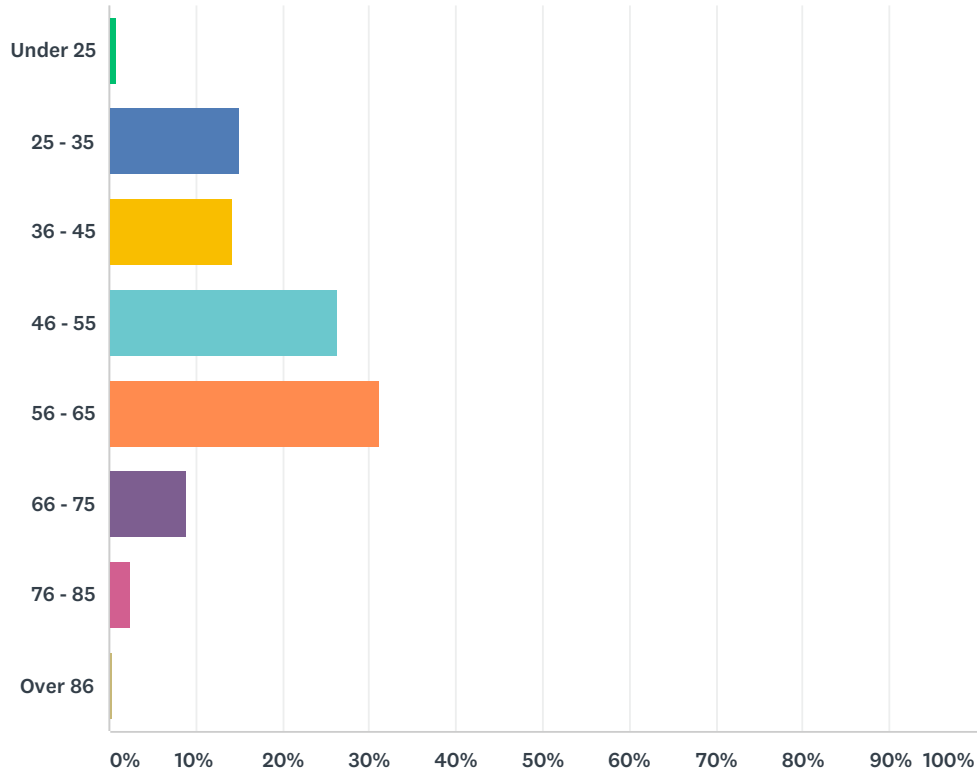

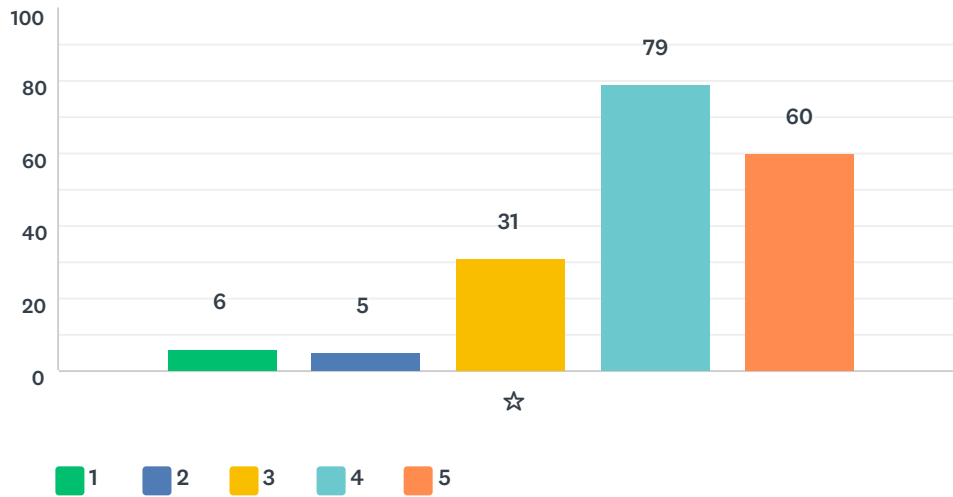

Q3 How would you rate the hotel rooms and service?

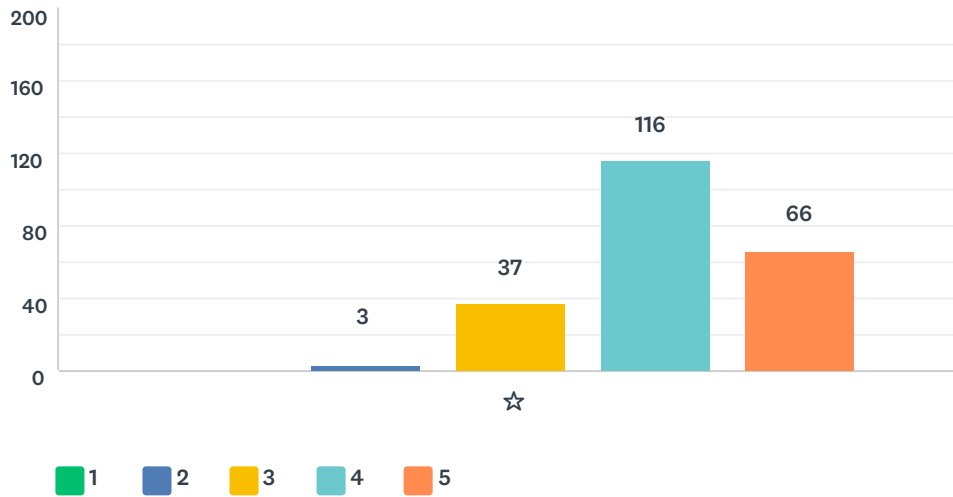

Q4 How would you rate the conference facilities for the meeting?

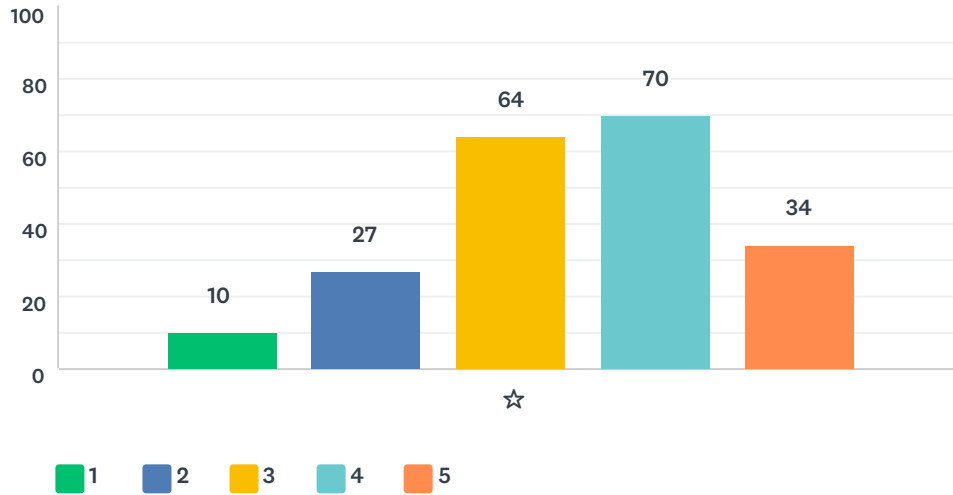

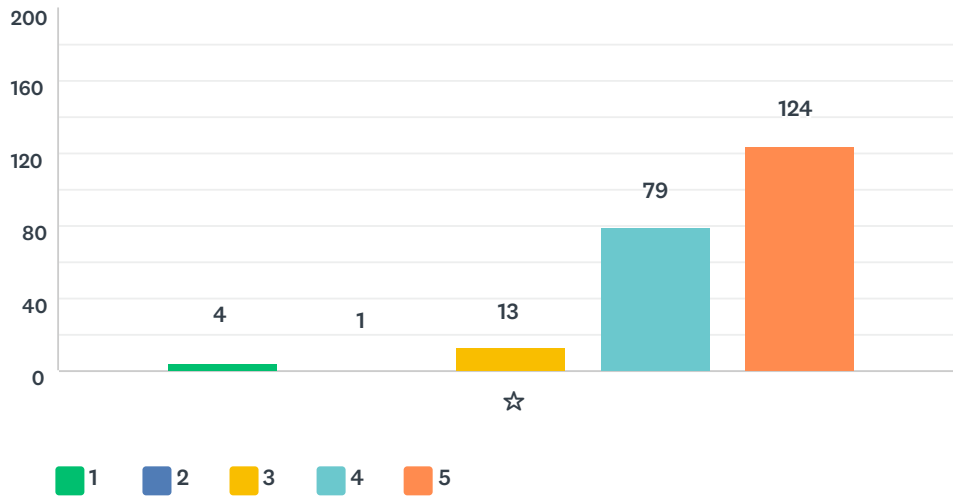

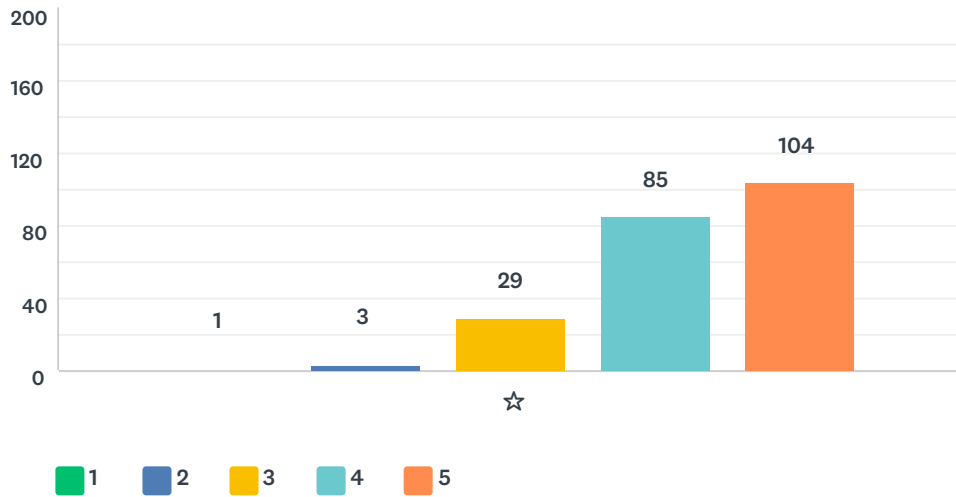

Q8 Did you have enough time to visit the exhibits?

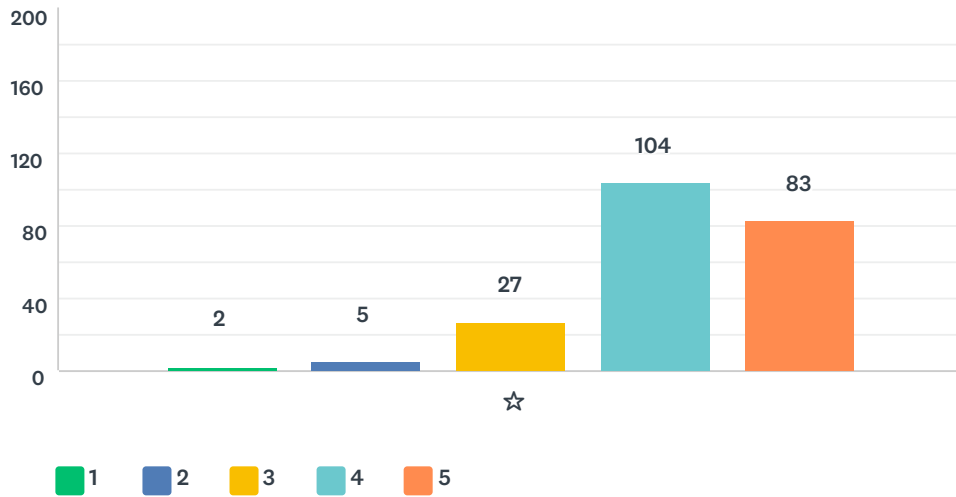

Q9 Were the lengths of the sessions appropriate?

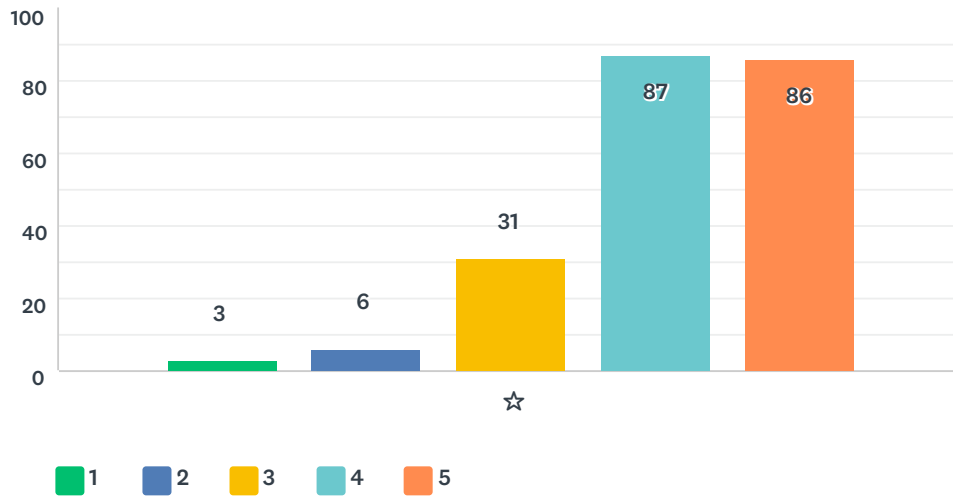

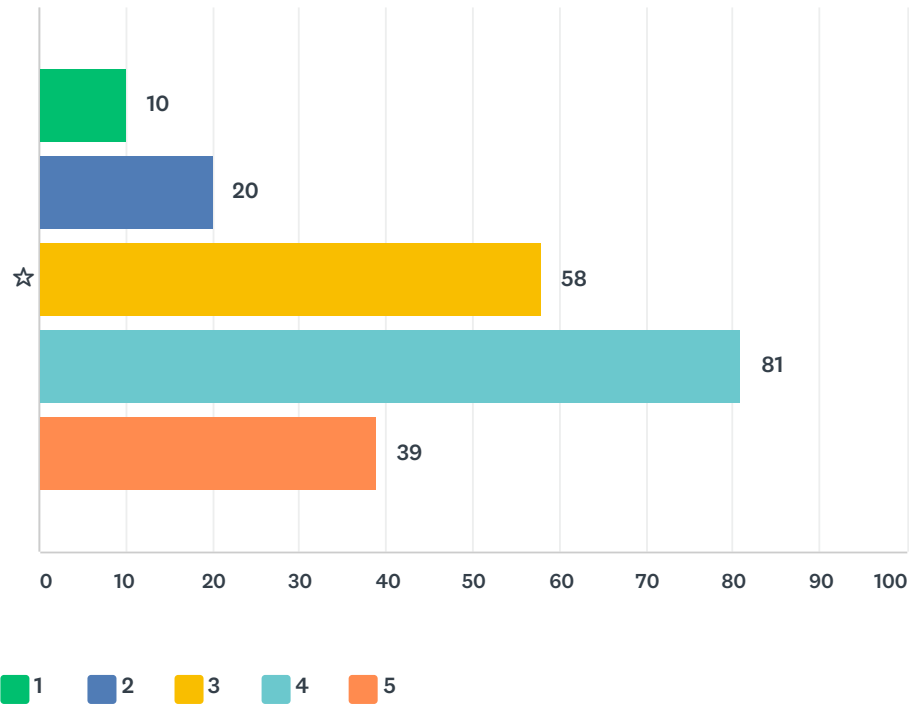

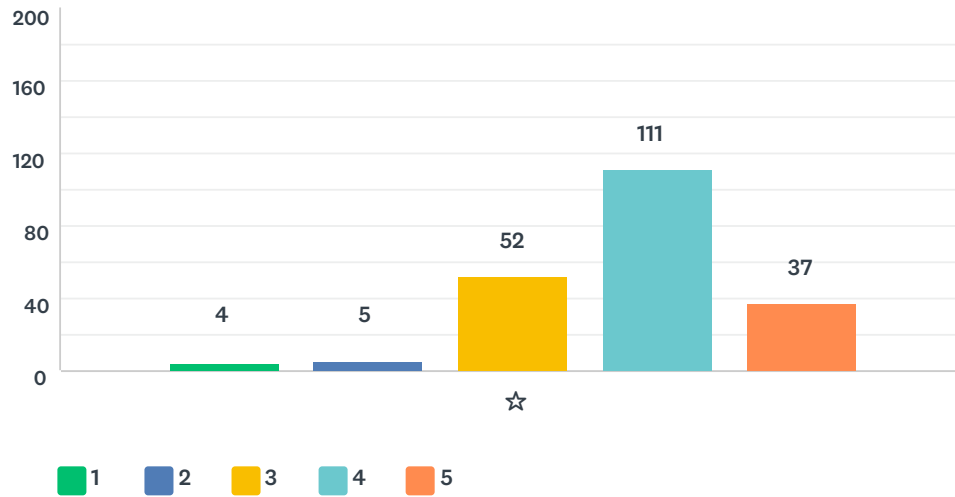

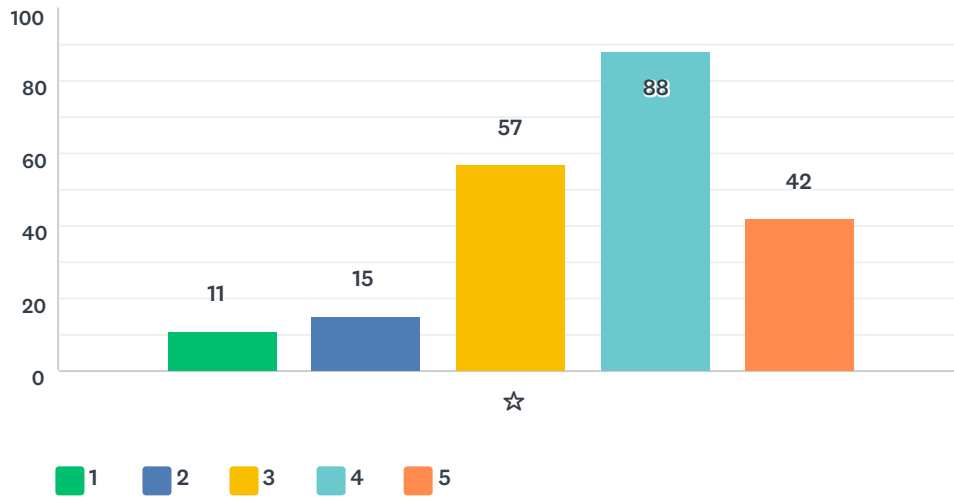

Q15 How would you rate the concurrent sessions?

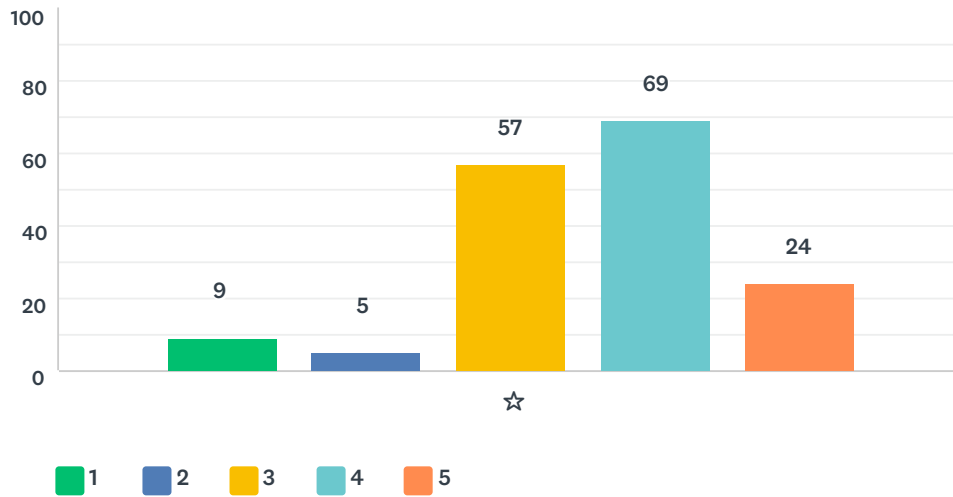

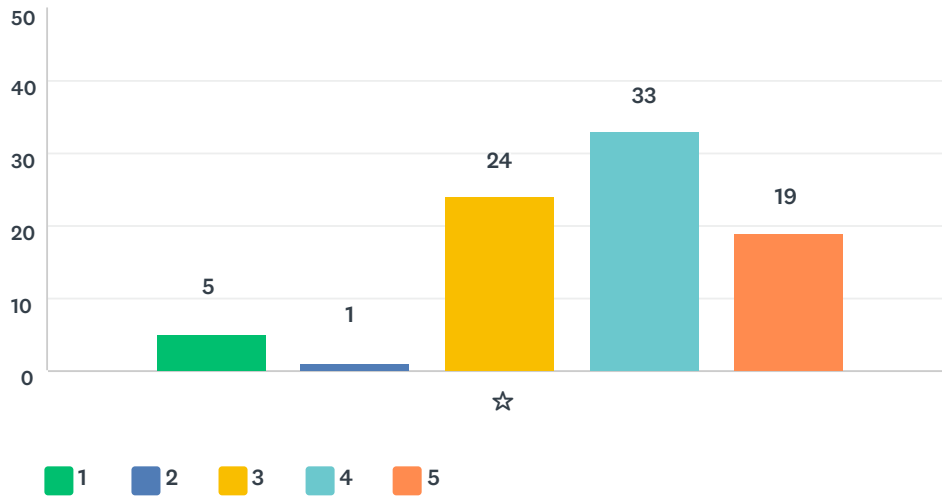

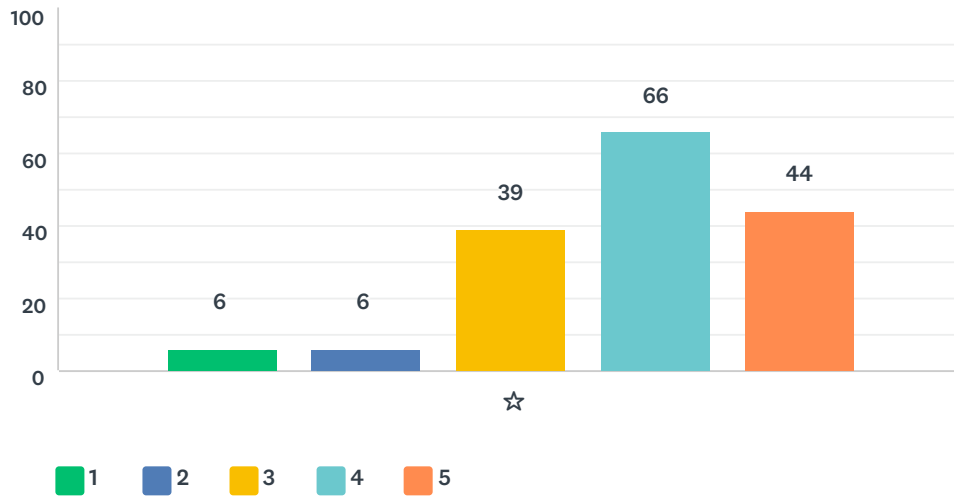

Q22 How did you like the Convocation Lunch?

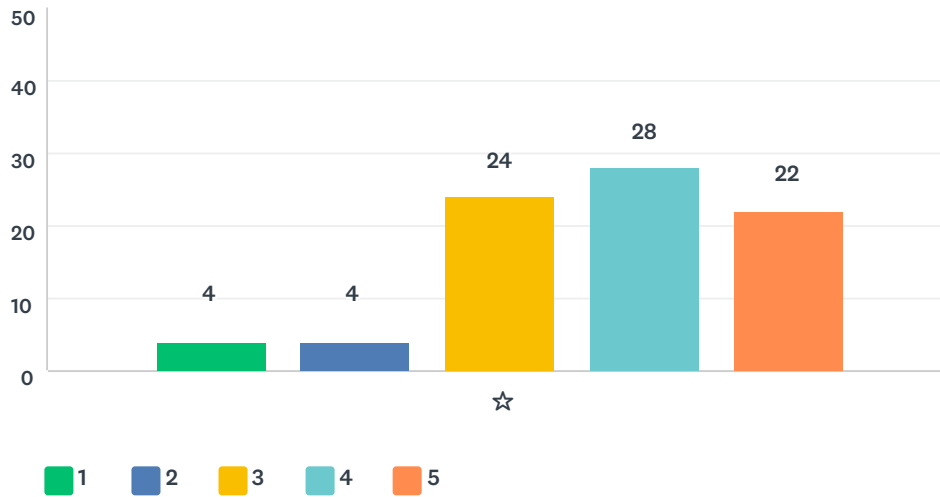

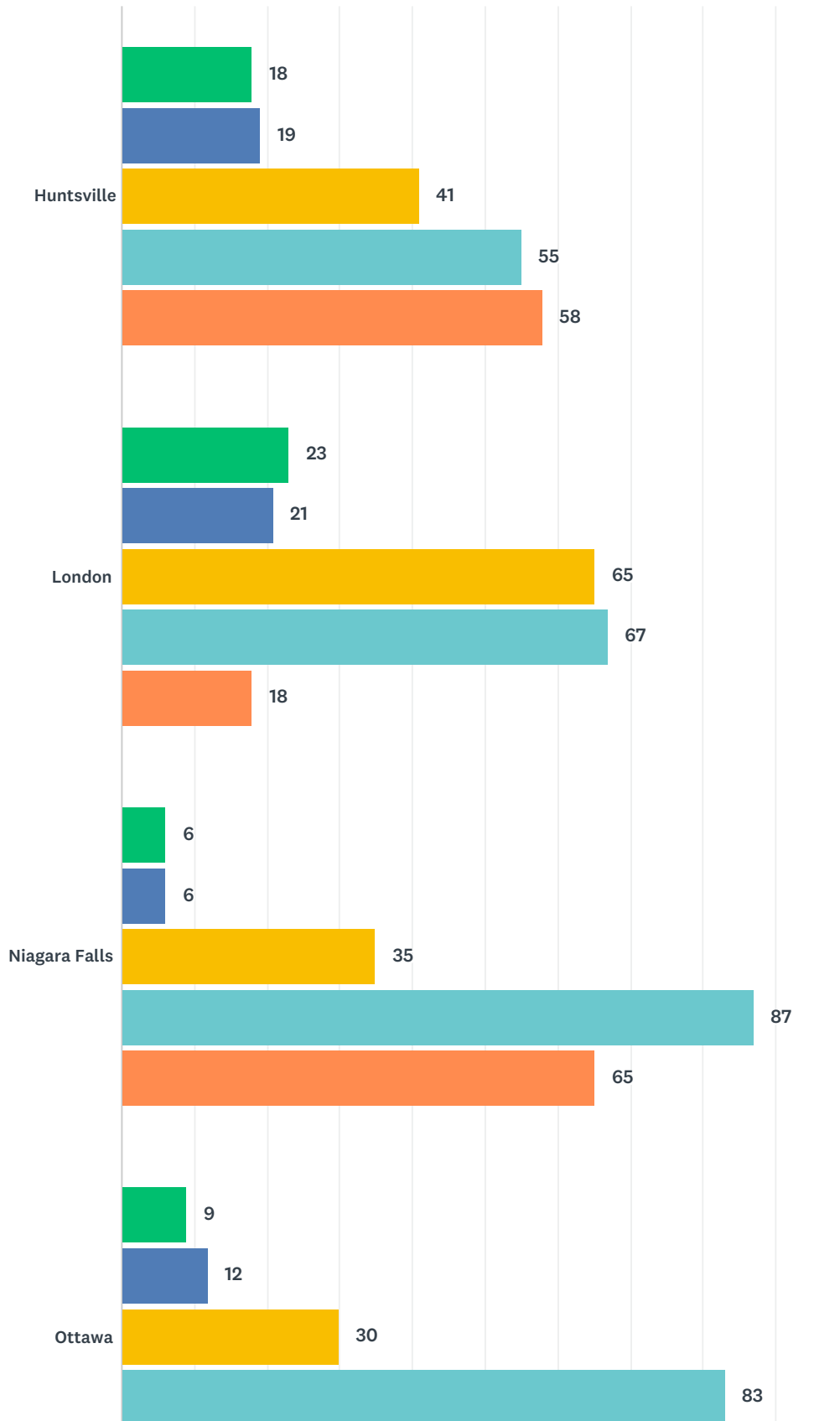

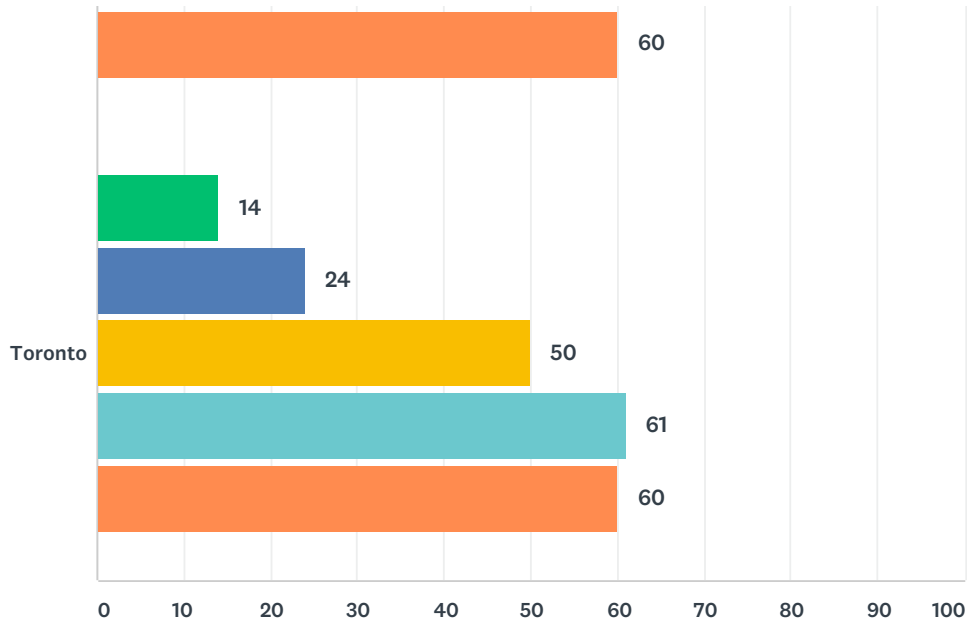
