

ROBERT MILES BONFELLOW

Robert Miles Bonfellow was born in the Town of Bury St. Edmund's, Suffolk, England, on February 22nd, 1851. He came to Canada about the year 1870, and shortly thereafter was articled to the firm of Wadsworth & Unwin, Provincial Land Surveyors, in the city of Toronto, and on passing his final examination as a Provincial Land Surveyor on October 7th, 1876, he remained in the employment of that firm for two or three years.

Subsequently he received an appointment in the Department of the Interior as Temporary Clerk, on the 28th September, 1881, and on June 1st, 1882, was promoted to permanent Junior Second Class Clerk.

He continued in this position until his death, which occurred on the 9th day of December, 1887, and was buried in St. Philip's Churchyard in Weston, Ontario. He was unmarried and an Anglican in religion.
