

## CHARLES D. CAMPBELL

---

Charles Donald Campbell, who became a Land Surveyor on February 19th, 1917, was the son of Donald McGregor Campbell, of Preston, Ont., who was a son of Donald McGregor Campbell, of Argyleshire, Scotland, and Margaret L. Scott, who was the daughter of John Scott and Jessie Walker, of Aberdeenshire, Scotland.



Charles was born in St. James, near Winnipeg, Manitoba, on August the 23rd, 1889, and died in the City of Belleville, Ont., on May 21st, 1929, and was laid to rest in Mt. View Cemetery, Galt, Ont.

He had a sister, Mrs. Harry Davidson, of Galt, and a brother, Noel S. Campbell, of Preston, Ont.

He was educated in the Cleveland and Ottawa Public schools, and matriculated from the Ottawa Collegiate in 1907, and entered the School of Practical Science, Toronto University, graduating, after a very credit-

able course, in 1911, as a Civil Engineer.

He articulated himself to Mr. J. W. Tyrrell, O.L.S., of Hamilton.

He was with the Canadian Pacific Railway Engineering staff for one year, after graduating. In 1912, he accepted the position of City Engineer of Galt, and for five years carried on all their Municipal Engineering, and at the same time, carried on the Municipal Engineering for the towns of Preston and Hespeler, and also acted as resident Engineer for the Galt, Preston and Hespeler Electric Railway. In 1917 he was in charge of the laying and paving work carried on by the Town of Lindsay. In 1922 he accepted the position of City Engi-

neer for the City of Belleville, where he also practiced Surveying, until his death.

On January 16th, 1914, he married Eva M. Picard, daughter of the late Mrs. James Picard, of Galt, by whom was born one son, Donald McGregor Campbell, being now 14 years of age, and attending the Belleville Collegiate Institute.

In Religion he was a Presbyterian, an ardent "Y" man, and enthusiastic golfer, and a member of the Belleville Golf Club.
