



JOSEPH ARCHIBALD CARMODY
1916 - 1992

J.A. (Archie) Carmody, 309 Morris Street, Pembroke, Ontario died at age 75 on December 2, 1991. Funeral services were held on December 5, 1991 at St. Columbkille's Cathedral and he was buried in St. Columba's Cemetery in Pembroke. He is survived by his wife Noreen and five (5) children and was predeceased by 1 daughter.

Archie Carmody was involved in surveying with F.W. Beatty, O.L.S., prior to joining the Canadian Army in 1940. There he served in the 1st Survey Regiment of the First Canadian Division in France, Germany and Italy until his discharge in 1945.

On his return he apprenticed with John E. Jackson, O.L.S. of the Ontario Department of Highways where he obtained his O.L.S. # 787. He continued to work there until his retirement in 1975.

Archie was an ardent fisherman and hunter, always enjoying the outdoor life in his native Renfrew County. Everyone who knew Archie, especially his old buddies from the Department of Highways, will miss the twinkle of his eye and his Irish humour.
