**WESTCOTT LYTTLETON CASSELS,
P. ENG., O.L.S., Q.L.S., D.L.S.**

Westcott Lyttleton Cassels was born in Ottawa, Ontario, on April 18th, 1888. He was the son of Emma & Robert Cassels, Q.C. He was educated at Ottawa Collegiate and McGill University, from which he graduated with a B.Sc., Civil Engineering in 1913. He immediately articulated with S.E. Farley for both Ontario and Quebec and was admitted to practice in 1915.

He served as a Captain in the Canadian Engineers overseas, 1915-1919 and rejoined in 1939 through 1945.

He resumed wide-spread surveying and engineering practice in Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba and the Northwest Territories with the firm of Farley, Cassels and McDougall.

In 1945, Mr. Cassels established his own private practice in Ottawa and served as Engineer for the Village of Rockcliffe Park until his retirement.

Mr. Cassels is survived by his wife, the former Kate W. Lawrence of Sherbrooke, Quebec.

He was a member of All Saints Anglican church, the Rideau Club, the Royal Ottawa Golf Club, an officer brother of the Order of St. John of Jerusalem, and was awarded the 1967 Centennial Medal for Distinguished Service to the Community.

Mr. Cassels passed away on October 21st, 1976.
