DONAT EMILE CHARTRAND

B.Sc., D.L.S. and O.L.S.

1885 - 1972

Donat Emile Chartrand was born the 30th of November, 1885, at Orleans, Ontario.

He attended Ottawa University from 1898 to 1905 and Queen's University from 1905 to 1909, graduating as B.Sc. in Civil Engineering.

His first appointment was with Topographical Survey of Canada, Department of the Interior, Ottawa, in 1909 under Doctor Deville, Surveyor General. He obtained his Commission as D.L.S. in 1911, as O.L.S. in 1917 and became a Member of Professional Engineers of Ontario in 1924.

Mr. Chartrand was employed from 1910 to 1930 on Dominion Land Surveys in all the provinces of Western Canada. In 1928 he worked with the late J. W. Pierce on chain control traverse in Ontario in connection with mapping from aerial photographs from Gravenhurst to North Bay. From 1932 on he was employed as O.L.S. on the survey of Intermediate aerodrome sites in connection with the Trans Canada Airway, from St. Eugene to Kenora comprising some forty odd sites; survey and posting of

the exterior boundaries of the penitentiary properties at Kingston and Collins Bay, Ontario, and Dorchester, New Brunswick; topographical surveys of Recreational centres at Toronto and Ottawa, Ontario and Ste. Anne de Bellevue, Quebec in connection with the convalescence of veterans of the last war, and many other miscellaneous surveys in Ontario such as Indian Reserve lots and villages, Radio Beacon sites in connection with T.C.A. and historical sites.

He retired on superannuation from the Department of Mines and Technical Surveys at Ottawa at the end of November, 1950, after forty one years of almost continuous service. After retirement he practised around Ottawa as an Ontario Land Surveyor up until three weeks before his death, at age eighty six.

Mr. Chartrand's wife, Mrs. Fleurette Chartrand, is still living in Ottawa.
