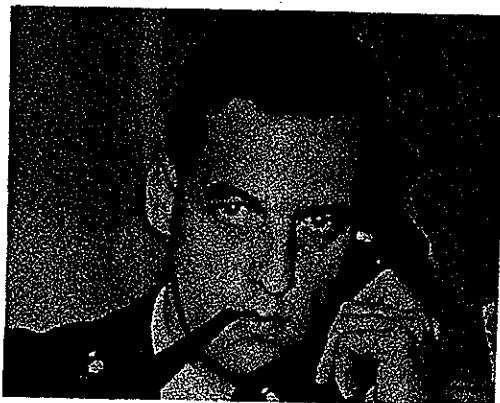
He received his early education at St. Mary's College, Trinidad. In 1949, he transferred to St. Michael's College, Toronto, where he completed his High School.

In 1952, John returned to Trinidad and St. Mary's College, where he taught until his emigration to Canada in 1954. He settled in Toronto and continued his education at Central Technical School.

Subsequently, he was employed by the Survey Department of Ontario Hydro and in 1956, he went to work for Messrs. Yates and McEwen as a Party Chief. Later, he worked for the Borough (then the Township) of North York in the same capacity and in 1959, he received his commission as an Ontario Land Surveyor. That same year he joined the firm of Yates and Yates. The winter of 1965 saw him relinquish this position to take up an appointment with the firm of Marshall Macklin Monaghan Limited, Ontario Land Surveyors in Don Mills. He remained with this firm until his sudden death on September 24, 1972.

John is survived by his wife Yolanda with their two sons and three daughters at home in Willowdale, his mother and two sisters in Trinidad and a sister in Toronto.

FRANKLIN BENN DECONKEY

It is with deep regret that we report the sudden passing of F. V. Deconkey on December 29, 1972.

Franklin Venn Deconkey was born in Toronto on April 15, 1928, the son of Albert L. Deconkey and the late Evelyn (Venn) Deconkey.

He received his primary education at Silverthorn Public School, Toronto, and at the North River Public School. He obtained his secondary school education at the Coldwater Continuation School and York Memorial Collegiate Institute. He graduated from the University of Toronto in 1952 with a Bachelor of Science, Forestry.

In November 1952, Frank joined Ontario Hydro, Survey Department as a member of the Junior Engineer in Training program. During his early career, he worked on a great number of engineering and legal survey projects throughout Ontario. He received his commission as an Ontario Land Surveyor in July 1954, after completing his term of Articles with Mr. W. H. Williams. In December 1955, he was promoted to District Surveyor at Belleville responsible for the Survey Department Operation in Southeastern Ontario. Frank returned to Toronto in 1960 as Project Surveyor in charge of survey work in Eastern Ontario including that on the Carillon and Mountain Chute Projects. In 1965, he assumed responsibility for the Survey Department activities in Southern Ontario. Frank was promoted to Senior Project Surveyor in January 1969, responsible for the Department's field operation throughout Ontario.

He was a member of the Association of Ontario Land Surveyors, the Canadian Institute of Surveying, the Ontario Professional Foresters Association, and a member of Cooksville United Church, Mississauga.

Frank enjoyed many outdoor activities including boating and fishing. Much of his leisure time was spent with his family and he was usually involved in a variety of projects both at home and the cottage.

Frank is survived by his wife, the former Mary Dobie whom he married in London, Ontario in 1957, a daughter Susan, a son David, and one sister Mrs. Joyce Irvine of Mississauga.
