

HERBERT C. DENNY

Was born in England in 1853, and came to Canada, and in 1872 articulated himself to Messrs. Wadsworth and Unwin, and was appointed a Land Surveyor for Ontario on the 7th October, 1876.

About this time he was bequeathed a considerable sum of money.

In 1879 he was engaged in Toronto at making reductions of township maps for Walker and Miles, Atlas publishers.

In 1882 he was engaged on Dominion Land Surveys, running township outlines between the 7th and 8th bases, west of range 25 and west of the 2nd Prin. Mer.

In 1885 he served as Lieutenant under Col. J. S. Dennis, D.L.S.

In 1897 he was a member of a survey party under Mr. Arthur O. Wheeler, D.L.S., making photo-topographical survey of the Foot Hills in the Province of Alberta for water storage in connection with irrigation, and taking meteorological data, and measurements of the streams and rivers for water supply.

From the 7th July, 1890, until the 12th March, 1894, he served as a constable in the Royal Canadian Mounted Police.

He did not marry, and died in Brandon, Manitoba, on the 17th February, 1900.
