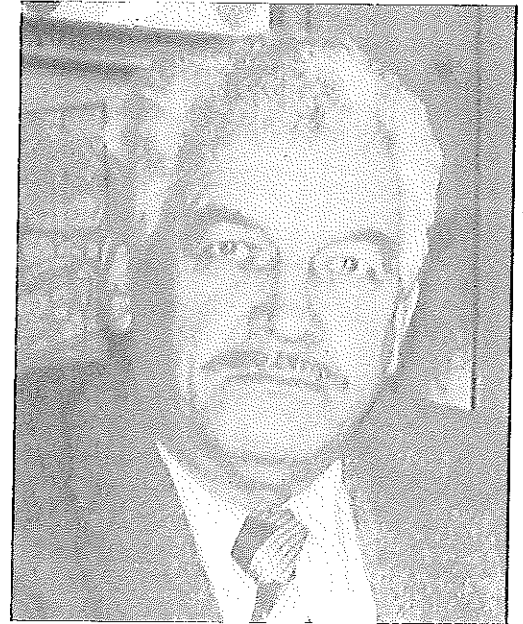


**Leonard Archibald Doxsee, O.L.S., B.Sc., P.Mgr.
September 1919 to October 2002**

Leonard was born on September 25th 1919 near Denbigh, Ontario, the son of Archibald Chapman Doxsee and Alberta Thompson. He married Alice Noreen Volk in 1946 who predeceased him in 2000. He had three children and five grandchildren.

He obtained his primary education at Avonmore Public School and his secondary education at Avonmore High School and Cornwall Collegiate Institute. He articled to Sydney W. Woods, O.L.S. and received his own O.L.S. commission in 1950.



He spent several years improving his education and completed many courses before receiving his Bachelor of Science degree from State University of New York.

After retiring from active practice at the end of 1981, he pursued other interests. He became involved in Mediation and completed several seminars and courses in that area. Other studies qualified him to receive membership in The Canadian Institute of Management receiving the designation of Professional Manager. Leonard served five years and nine months in the Canadian Army during the Second World War with A Battery First Field Regiment. He landed in Britain in July of 1940 and served with the British Eighth Army in Sicily and Italy and with the Canadian Army in France, Belgium, Holland and Germany.

Leonard was recommended for a commission and left Italy to return to England to begin training in February 1944. In June of that year the huge Normandy Invasion began. The war seemed to be near an end soon and he lost interest in receiving a commission and focused on getting home. He rejoined his unit in Italy and remained with them for the remainder of the war.

Leonard died on October 30th 2002 and was buried in Cataragui Cemetery, Kingston.
