SAMUEL EVERT FLOOK O.L.S., D.L.S., B.A.Sc., M.E.I.C.



Samuel Evert Flook was born at Willowdale, Ontario, on March 12th, 1887, to Benjamin Franklin Flook and his wife, Harriet Elsie Cummer.

After attending Willowdale schools he graduated from the University of Toronto and obtained his degree of Bachelor of Applied Science in 1912. He then apprenticed himself to W. S. Gibson, O. L. S., and was granted his certificate as an Ontario Land Surveyor on February 18th, 1913.

In September, 1913, he moved to Port Arthur and established an engineering and surveying practice, specializing in the survey of mining claims and subdivisions. He was employed by the C. D.

Howe Company on the construction of elevator and docks at Port Arthur and Fort William until 1934 when he was appointed City Engineer at Port Arthur. When he retired as City Engineer, he continued his practice as a surveyor.

Mr. Flook was active in community work, having served as Alderman in Port Arthur from 1930 to 1934, and was associated with the Boy Scouts, Red Cross and Young Men's Christian Association. He was a charter member and President of the Kiwanis Club. He was a Past President of the Port Arthur Golf and Country Club, and an ardent fisherman. He was a member of Trinity United Church, a Mason and Shriner.

Mr. Flook married Miss Jessie Robb, and there were two children - John Cummer and Sheila. He died February 3rd, 1961, and was interred at Port Arthur
