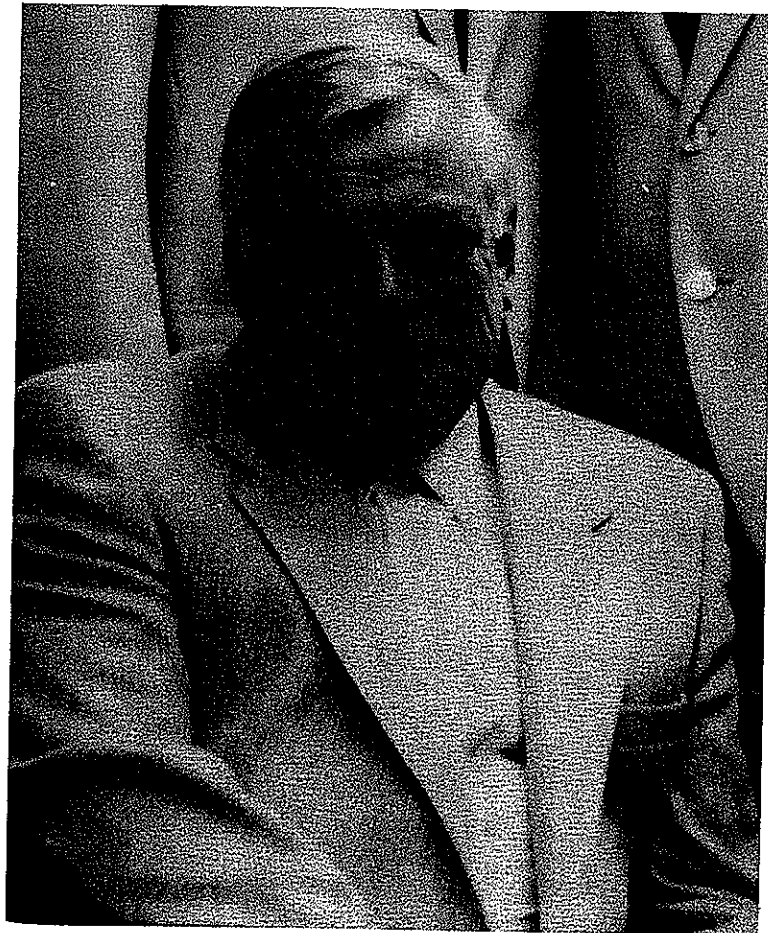


## PHILIP ARTHUR HARROLD 1926 - 1996

Philip (Phil) Harrold passed away peacefully in hospital in Edmonton, Alberta on December 30, 1996 after a long and courageous fight against cancer. He was 70 years old. A memorial service was held in Edmonton on January 3, 1997, and a funeral service in St. Bridgid's Church in Ottawa on January 7th. He is survived by his wife Francoise (Frances), two sisters, three sons and six grandchildren.



During World War II, Phil served in the Fleet Air Arm of the British Navy in HMS Warrior. After the war he joined the Legal Surveys Branch at Ottawa City Hall. He served his articles under Art McKnight and received his commission as an Ontario Land Surveyor on June 10, 1955. He remained there until his early retirement in December 1985.

Throughout his professional career, Phil Harrold insisted on quality workmanship, both from himself and those who worked with him. He was noted for his dedication to surveying and his willingness to adopt new ideas while still recognising the importance of traditional approaches.

Phil was a member of the Eastern Regional Group of the Association. He had many other interests and devoted a great deal of voluntary time to them. For example, for five years he was the President of the Civic Institute of Professional Personnel at Ottawa City Hall. He was also Secretary-Treasurer of the Ottawa Municipal Employees Credit Union for 20 years, and was its President for another 10 years.

It is often said that if you want something done, look around for the busiest person, and ask him or her. Phil was such a person, always ready to invest his time and energy for the benefit of others.
