**GEORGE HOGARTH, O.L.S., P.Eng.**

MR. HOGARTH was born at Toronto on April 11th, 1886, to George William Hogarth and his wife, Mary E. Foad.

After attending Lansdowne Public School and Harbord Collegiate, he graduated from the School of Practical Science in 1909, and after serving his apprenticeship with A. J. B. Halford, O.L.S., was granted his certificate as an Ontario Land Surveyor in February, 1912.

Mr. Hogarth was Assistant Engineer with Department of Public Works, Ontario, from 1909 to 1916, Chief Engineer of the Department of Highways from 1916 to 1926, and Deputy Minister of the Department of Public Work from 1926 to 1934.

He served with the Building and Works Section of the Royal Canadian Air Force from 1939 to 1945, and later was associated with the George W. Rayner Construction Company. He served on the Council of the Association and was President in 1922.

Mr. Hogarth married Margaret Fairbairn and their children were Margaret Eleanor (Mrs. H. R. Bates), Marion Louise (Mrs. Wm. Filipink), and Gordon Fairbairn.

He was an elder at Bloor St. United Church. He died on the 22nd of June, 1961, and was buried at Toronto.
