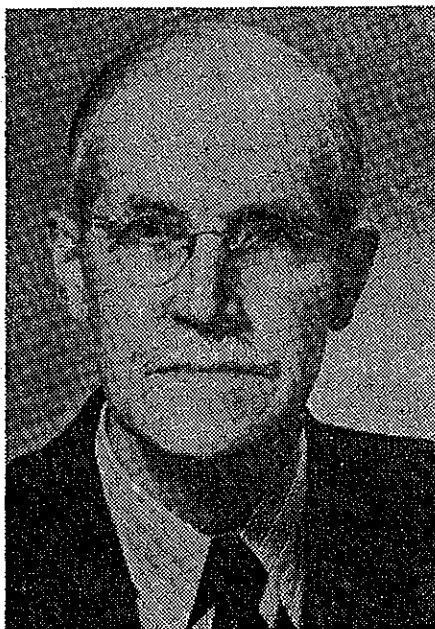


REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BIOGRAPHY



**PERCIVAL ANTHONY JACKSON, O.L.S.**

MR. P. A. JACKSON, the son of Thomas Anthony Jackson and Elizabeth Greeves, was born at Belfast, Ireland, on November 13th, 1875. He attended secondary school in Warwick, England, and came to Ontario.

He was employed as a draughtsman in the Department of Mines and resigned to serve his apprenticeship with G. S. Abrey at Toronto. He was granted his certificate as an Ontario Land Surveyor on February 11th, 1914. After obtaining his certificate, he was employed as a surveyor with the Department of Mines, and later as Chief Cartographer with that Department, which position he held until his retirement in 1945. He was instrumental in the design and format of the various maps prepared by that Department.

Mr. Jackson married Clara Penelope Moffat and there were two daughters — Catherine Eizalbeth (Mrs. C. E. Morris) and Clara Gilbertina (Mrs. T. H. Bridle).

He attended Calvary Church and died at Toronto on April 28th, 1960.
