

RICHARD JERMY JEPHSON

Was born in 1853, in Sussex, England. He died on the 29th June, 1929, in Brandon, Manitoba, where he was buried.

He was the son of the Rev. J. M. Jephson. His grandfather was J. Preston-Jermy Jephson, of Norfolk, England.

He came to Canada, and was living in Barrie, Ont., where he studied surveying with the Rev. Canon Fred Armstrong, P.L.S. and D.L.S., and he qualified for a Land Surveyor for Ontario on the 7th April, 1867.

He practised surveying in Bracebridge until he went to Manitoba in 1883.

On the 3rd November, 1881, he married Miss E. C. Thompson at the Holy Trinity Church, Toronto. There were no children.

He surveyed in Dawson, Yukon Territory, from 1892 until 1898. He resided in Manitoba, at Brandon, where he surveyed from 1898 until 1905, when he went into partnership with the late C. C. Chattawa from 1905 until

1907, and surveyed timber limits for the Dominion Government.

A brother came from England and practised law in Calgary, until he died several years ago. C. D. H. Jephson, his only living brother, late of the Royal Irish Constabulary, lives at Charing, Kent County, England. A. J. Mounteney Jephson, another brother, was with H. M. Stanley on his expedition to Africa.
