

## CHARLES ALBERT JONES

Was born the 15th August, 1855, in the 5th Concession of London township, and died the 17th January, 1936, and was buried in Woodland Cemetery, London, Ont.

He was a son of Charles V. Jones and his wife Mary Carter.



His grandparents were Thomas Jones and his wife Ann Atfield, who came to Canada in 1823, and settled in London township.

He was educated at the Grammar School in London, Ont. And was articled to James McMillan, P.L.S., and was appointed a Land Surveyor for Ontario on the 8th April, 1881.

In 1901 he married Mary Louise Hicks, in Christ Church, Petrolia. They had one son, named Charles Harold Llewelyn, who is a druggist, with a store in Leamington, Ont.

He was a member of the Anglican Church, and his hobbies were collecting books and nature study.

He did not connect himself with societies, but confined his activities entirely to church work, having been warden, lay delegate to synod, secretary for British and Foreign Bible Society, etc., as well as having been connected with choir work for over sixty years, and was choirmaster over twenty years.

After being articled to James McMillan, and receiving his O.L.S. he joined the firm of Peters and Jones, later with Mr. Farncomb, and later this partnership was dissolved, and he came to Petrolia about 1895, and practised there until his death—forming a partnership with J. C. Monteith, O.L.S., in 1828.

He was also a D.L.S. He established many lines and boundaries, but his main professional work was confined to drainage work and subdivisions.
