HERBERT JOHNSTON, O.L.S.

MR. JOHNSTON was the son of John James Johnston and Margaret Beatty, and was born at Meaford on April 21st, 1874.

He attended the Public and High Schools at Meaford, and graduated from the School of Practical Science in 1903. He served his apprenticeship with W. M. Davis, O.L.S. at Kitchener and was granted his certificate in February, 1905.

Mr. Johnston joined Mr. W. M. Davis in partnership from 1904 to 1910, and also was Assistant City Engineer at Kitchener. He was City Engineer at Kitchener from 1910 to 1917. He was Engineer for Waterloo County, as well as the towns of Hespler, Preston, Elmira and New Hamburg. Also he was Engineer for the Townships of Waterloo and Wilmot.

He was appointed as member of Kitchener Road Commission and Kitchener Planning Board. He was an active member of King Street Baptist Church at Kitchener, and other community efforts.

Mr. Johnston married Ellen Agnes Clarke, and their children were Ruth A., Alehea M., and Herbert Paul.

Mr. Johnston died in Kitchener on June 13th, 1961.

NORVAL CLARENCE LLOYD, O.L.S.

MR. LLOYD was born in King Township in County of York on July 25th, 1886.

Following completion of his course at the Collegiate Institute, he enrolled at the School of Practical Science where he graduated in 1909. He served his apprenticeship with H. L. Esten, O.L.S., and was admitted to practice in February, 1912.

He joined the Works Department of the City of Toronto in April, 1915, and was appointed Chief of Surveys of that Department in 1920. In April, 1932, he was appointed Superintendent of Asphalt Work, and continued with the Roads Department until his superannuation in May of 1955.

Mr. Lloyd married Edith Townsend, who predeceased him in 1961. He died at Toronto on the 9th of March, 1962.
