The subject of this sketch was born in Charleston, South Carolina, January 6th, 1851, of French Huguenot descent, his ancestors having settled in "The Carolinas," in 1686. He came to London, Ont., in 1869, and was educated at Hellmuth College. He became articled to T. W. Dyas, and later to William McMillan, of London, Ont., and passed his final examinations on July 8th, 1876. Three years later, the death occurred of Mr. McMillan. Mr. Manigault moved to Strathroy in 1877, where he continued to reside and practise his profession until his death. He was appointed Engineer to the town of Strathroy and nine adjoining townships. He surveyed the Muncey Indian Reserve, Crown Lands in Sombra Township and was

Engineer on a large number of Provincial and Municipal drains.

He was married on October 27th, 1885 to Mrs. Isabella Macintyre, second daughter of E. Woodbury, Esq., of London, Ont.

He died suddenly at his home on August 20th, 1916, leaving a wife and one sister, Miss Eliza Manigault of London, to mourn his loss.
