**CHARLES HERBERT MEADER**

Was a son of Theodore Meader and his wife Mary Murphy of Orillia, Ont. He was born there on the 1st February, 1885, and was educated there in the Separate and High School, and graduated from the School of Practical Science in 1910.

He was articled to J. W. FitzGerald of Peterboro, and was appointed an O.L.S. on the 18th August, 1917. He died in Toronto on 23rd August, 1936, and was buried there.

His professional activities were with the Northern Development Highways Branch of Ontario.

Theodore Meader, his father, was born and lived in Watertown, N.Y. But he settled in Orillia, Ont., after he married.

His paternal ancestor came to America from Wales on the *Mayflower* in 1642, and Mary Murphy, his mother, was of Irish descent.

Charles had three sisters and three brothers, viz.: Kathleen Meader, nurse, Watertown, N.Y.; Dr. Florence Meader-Rees, Chicago, Ill.; the late F. Daniel Meader, who died in 1924; the late Joseph Cave Meader, who died in 1927, and was a Civil Engineer in Fort William; Jack Meader, Sub-manager of the Telephone Co., Wilmington, Delaware; Miss Mildrid Meader, a 3rd year Medical Student, who died in 1908.

Theodore Meader, the aged father of Charles, is yet living, but Mary Murphy, his mother, died twenty-two years ago.
