**LLOYD PETERS O.L.S..**

Lloyd Peters was born on May 15, 1915 in Cochrane, Ontario, one of six children of Rosina M. and the late Frederick C. Peters.

The family moved to Toronto, and Lloyd received his education at Bowmore Road Public School, and Danforth Technical School.

Lloyd served in the Governor-General's Horse Guards from 1939 to 1945 and fought in the campaigns in Italy and North-western Europe.

After the war, Lloyd dedicated himself to surveying. He was apprenticed to the later Mr. S. Lanson and received his commission as an O.L.S. in 1959. He worked for the City of Toronto for some time, and spent several years with Mr. H. Sewell. He established his own practice and worked in many areas, including Metropolitan Toronto, Haliburton and many summers in Algonquin Park.

True to the outdoor calling, Lloyd was an avid golfer, and one of his prouder moments was a hole-in-one, scored at the old Cliffside Golf Course.

Lloyd is survived by his sisters Freda MacNabb, Toronto, Ruth Hammill, Etobicoke, Margaret Edwards, Lorne Park, his brothers Fred, Kemptville, Charles, Bronte and his mother Rosina, a wonderful lady of 90 years.

Lloyd Peters passed away on the 19th of April 1976.
