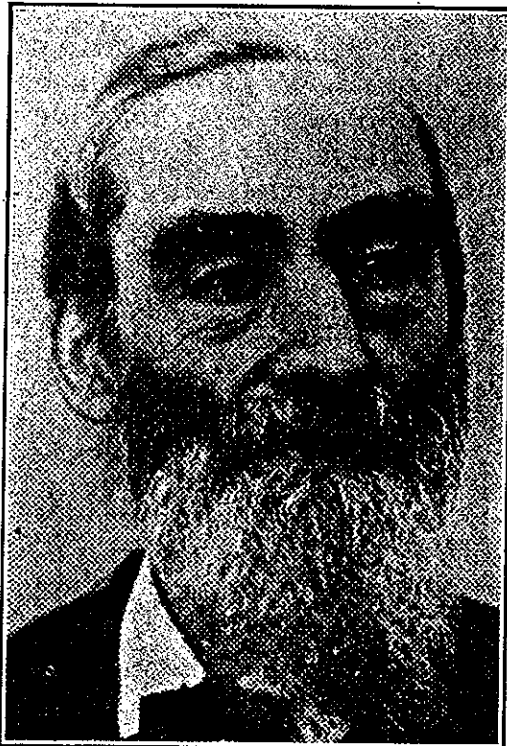


THOMAS CHEVALIER PROSSER

Whose parents were John Prosser and Mary Bagster, were married July 18th, 1797, in London, England.

Thomas Chevalier was born in London, England, on April 14th, 1818, and died in Detroit, Mich., April 12th, 1893, and was buried there in Woodmere Cemetery.



His wife was Mercy Lawrence, daughter of Monnis and Fanny Lawrence, born in Toronto, July 8th, 1821, and died in Detroit, March 18th, 1887, and buried beside her husband in Woodmere Cemetery.

They were married in St. George's Church, Toronto, Canada West, on August 29th, 1850.

The brother of the subject of this sketch was John; sisters, Mary (Mrs. William Bagster), Emma and Martha. None of whom are living.

He was articled to Sandford Flemming, and was appointed a Land Surveyor on April 5th, 1850.

Mary, a daughter of Thomas C., married Edward Trott, one of the prominent families of Collingwood, now residing at 329 Milton Drive, San Gabriel, Calif., U.S.A. And Mr. Harry Trott, a nephew of Edward, married a daughter of Dr. Aylsworth, of Collingwood.

William Prosser, a son of Thos. Chevalier, has two sons named Eugene and Clare Cumming. And a daughter named Frances Prosser Henderson—deceased—no children.

It does not appear as if Mr. Prosser practised much at surveying. He was the first Master of Manito Lodge No. 90, A.F. and A.M., in Collingwood, and a druggist there.

Previous to 1857, he moved to Detroit, where he practised law until his death.

He was an Episcopalian.
