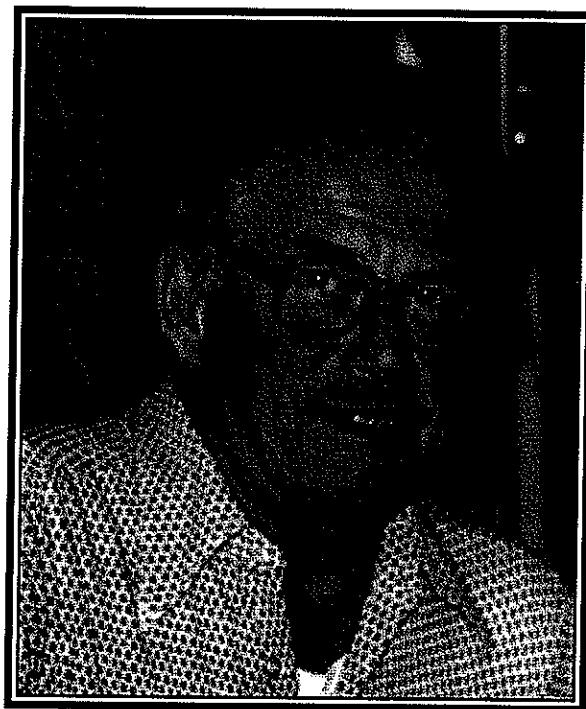

CHARLES FRANCIS REDDY
1926-1992

Charles (Chuck) Reddy died suddenly at his home in Calabogie on February 10, 1992. He is survived by his wife Rhodena, a son Kerry, a daughter-in-law Evelyn and three grand children: Tyler, Adam and Erica, his three brothers: Jim of Newmarket, Pat of Norwood, and Michael of Arnprior.

Having completed high school, Chuck joined the Air Force at the age of seventeen, in 1943. He completed a Wireless Air Gunner's Course and was honourably released in 1946.

Following this short career, Chuck came back to the Ottawa Valley where he obtained work with Ontario Hydro. As an employee with the survey department, Chuck decided to further his studies in the survey field. He received his commission as an Ontario Land Surveyor in 1969 and continued his employment with the survey department of Ontario Hydro on many projects in both Northern and Southern Ontario, until his retirement in 1974. During his employment with Ontario Hydro, Chuck developed a lasting friendship with many of his fellow workers. After his retirement, Chuck worked for several years as the resident surveyor for the E.W. Petzold firm in Renfrew.

Chuck was a very active member of his community and served as an extraordinary minister in his church. He was an eager outdoors person, an avid fisherman and hunter.
