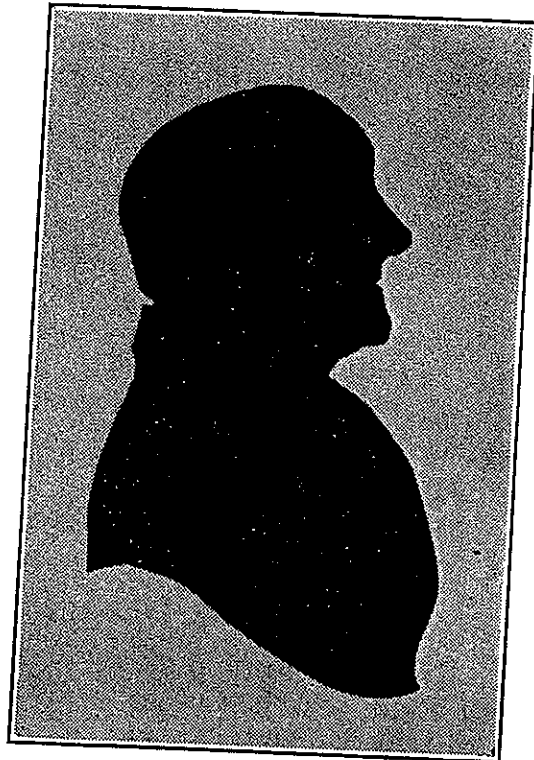

Angus made the following surveys for the Government:—
 Viz: March 19th, 1827, survey part of the township of Roxborough. September 20th, 1822, survey west boundary township Lancaster and Gore. September 12th, 1828, survey part Caledonia township. October 3rd, 1829, complete survey of the township Caledonia.

He was a Captain of the 3rd Glengarry Regiment of Militia raised in Lochiel township in 1827. He was Corporal of the same in 1838. Captain of the 3rd Regiment of Militia raised in Lochiel in 1839.

He died at Dalhousie Mills on February 21st, 1873, and on the monument to his memory in Dalhousie Mills cemetery he is designated as Colonel.

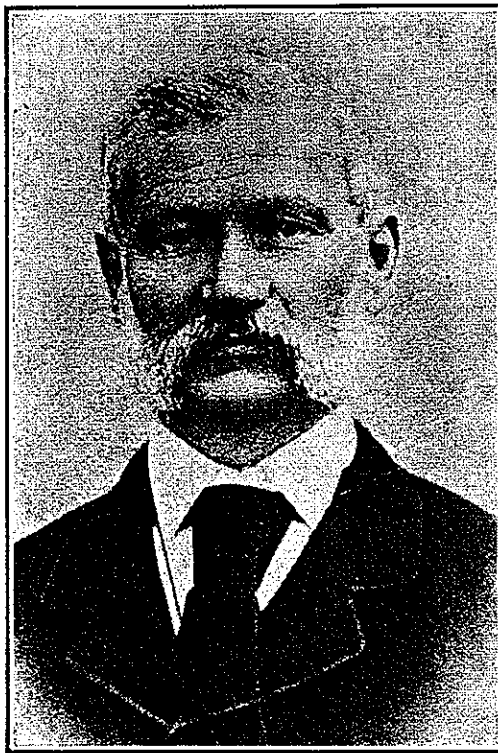

JAMES HALES REID

Was a son of Henry Solomon Reid and his wife Caroline Blair, and was born in Calcutta on December 16th, 1822, and died in Bowmanville on December 22nd, 1899, and was buried there.



Henry and Caroline his wife were the first of the family to come to Canada.

Their children were James Hales Reid (the subject of this sketch); Blair Francis, who was Major-General in the Bengal Army; Anne Jane, who died aged three; Henry Robert, physician, who was the father of Mrs. George Stiff, Toronto; and George Morrison.

Caroline died and Henry married the second time to Elizabeth Hagarty, the issue being John Lestock Reid, O.L.S. and D.L.S., whose biography appears in our 1919 Annual Report; Lestock Holland, who was a physician in Bowmanville, Ont.; Anne Georgina Susan, unmarried.

James Hales Reid was married twice. First to Eliza Ann Roles in Colborne on May 7th, 1863, who died at Sangor, India, on June 22nd, 1872. His second wife was Ellen Andrews King at Port Hope, Ontario, on February 12th, 1881; who died at Port Hope on January 10th, 1928.

Children by first marriage.

1. Jane Caroline, who married V. Robin, deceased.
2. Harriet Alice died aged eleven.

By his second marriage; the only child being Frederick Blair Reid, who is a member of the staff of the Geodetic Survey of Canada, at Ottawa, and who supplied the data for this biography. He was born in Bowmanville on October 17th, 1883,

and married Anna Ethel Bishop at Ottawa on May 24th, 1912, without issue.

He has been with the Geodetic Survey since January 1st, 1908. Supervisor of Levelling from 1915 to the present time. He attended the Bowmanville High School, graduating from Toronto University in Engineering in 1904. Returned for post graduate course in fall of 1905, and securing B.A.Sc. degree in 1906. He was with the late Willis Chipman from 1904 till 1907.

James Hales Reid was in partnership with the late William Murdock, O.L.S., C.E.

He was an Anglican, and practised surveying around Bowmanville. He was appointed a land surveyor on October 6th, 1860.
