William Arthur Serack was born in Hamilton, Ontario and moved to Brantford at an early age. He attended Brantford Collegiate and played football and rugby there. He obtained his BA from the University of Waterloo and an MA in Mathematics from Queen's University in Kingston.

After a brief stint with Statistics Canada he returned to Brantford and began his career in surveying with Bill West and later Sep Ruuska, where he completed his articles after obtaining the necessary courses at Erindale College.

Bill was commissioned as an Ontario Land Surveyor on June 27, 1979. He then moved to Kitchener, where he worked

for J. Douglas Ansley until he became a partner in Ansley Campbell & Serack Ltd in 1994 when Doug Ansley retired. This firm became one of the founding firms of ACI Survey Consultants Inc in 2003. Bill was a thorough and dedicated land surveyor whose work will stand the test of time.

He will also be remembered as an avid Hamilton Tiger Cat fan, selfless volunteer at Grand River Hospital, blood donor, YMCA member and a good friend and colleague.
