Campbell Taylor Smith was born in Sarnia on July 13, 1890 to Thomas and Mary Smith. He received his early schooling in Sarnia and Chatham and in 1909 he graduated from Normal School.

Mr. Smith served in France with the Second Division of Artillery in World War One. Following his return to Canada, he enrolled in the University of Toronto from which he graduated with a B.A.Sc., in 1921.

He apprenticed with Frank Rutherford, O.L.S. of St. Catharines and was commissioned as an Ontario Land Surveyor in 1922. He then entered into partnership with Mr. Rutherford in St. Catharines during which time he worked on the Water Filtration Plant in Thorold, water, sewers and roads in Merritton and general survey and engineering work in and around St. Catharines.

Later, he moved to Oshawa where he was associated with Mr. Donevan, O.L.S.

Subsequently, he moved to Kingston and opened an engineering and survey practice in partnership with his son Donald.

He was married to the former Verna Hetherington of St. Catharines and they had two sons, Donald Campbell Smith and Hubert Alexander Smith.

B.Sc., D.L.S. and O.L.S.

1885 - 1972

Donat Emile Chartrand was born the 30th of November, 1885, at Orleans, Ontario.

He attended Ottawa University from 1898 to 1905 and Queen's University from 1905 to 1909, graduating as B.Sc. in Civil Engineering.

His first appointment was with Topographical Survey of Canada, Department of the Interior, Ottawa, in 1909 under Doctor Deville, Surveyor General. He obtained his Commission as D.L.S. in 1911, as O.L.S. in 1917 and became a Member of Professional Engineers of Ontario in 1924.

Mr. Chartrand was employed from 1910 to 1930 on Dominion Land Surveys in all the provinces of Western Canada. In 1928 he worked with the late J. W. Pierce on chain control traverse in Ontario in connection with mapping from aerial photographs from Gravenhurst to North Bay. From 1932 on he was employed as O.L.S. on the survey of Intermediate aerodrome sites in connection with the Trans Canada Airway, from St. Eugene to Kenora comprising some forty odd sites; survey and posting of
