

JOHN ASPENWELL TULLY

Was a son of John Tully, Senior Captain in the English Navy, born in 1812 at Limerick, Ireland.

He was a brother of Kivas Tully, Provincial Architect, Toronto.



In 1838 John married Anne Helena Watson, daughter of Richard Watson, Queen's Printer, Publisher of Upper Canada Gazette for 20 years.

He was appointed a Land Surveyor on the 28th Nov., 1845.

He died Nov. 10th, 1886, at Glencoe, New Mexico. His wife died Feb. 18th, 1918, at Glencoe, Lincoln County, New Mexico.

He was educated at Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland, and was Professor of Mathematics of Upper Canada College, Toronto. He was Lieutenant and Adjutant of Queen's Own Rifles, Toronto.

As a contractor he built the first section of the lake wall at Toronto in 1864. He surveyed the Trunk line to Detroit.

He moved to Chicago in 1865, where he had offices as an Architect. He moved to New Mexico in 1879.

He is survived by two of his nine children, viz.: James V. Tully, Glencoe, New Mexico, and Mrs. Frank Coe, of Roswell, New Mexico.
