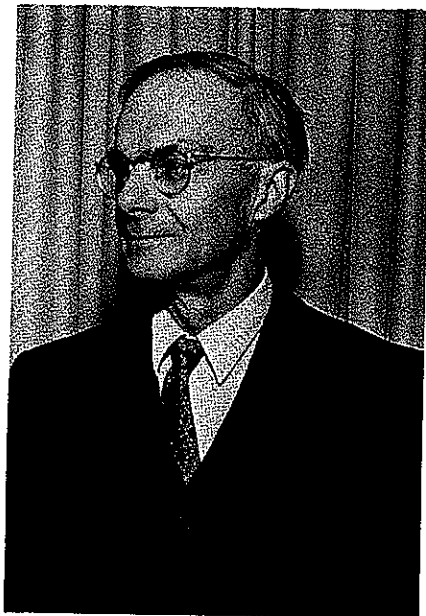


## BIOGRAPHIES



DOUGLAS GORDON URE

Douglas Gordon Ure was born in Woodstock, Ontario. His parents were Frederick John Ure O.L.S., and Elizabeth Ann Ure. Mr. Ure lived in St. Catharines for 55 years where he operated a Consulting Engineering and Ontario Land Surveying firm with his two sons, Robert and Frederick.

Mr. Ure graduated from University of Toronto in 1921 with a degree in Civil Engineering, and worked for the Ontario Department of Health in this area until 1924 when he became the Assistant City Engineer for the City of Sarnia. He moved to St. Catharines in 1926 to work in the same capacity for the City. For many years he acted as Municipal Engineer for the Town of Niagara, the Townships of Grantham and Clinton, the Town and Township of Thorold.

Mr. Ure articulated to the late J. A. Baird in Sarnia and received his commission as an O.L.S. in 1922. He formed a partnership with F. N. Rutherford O.L.S. in 1927 and took over the business in 1933 on the death of Mr. Rutherford. His involvement with the company continued over the years with the assistance of his two sons, both of whom are Ontario Land Surveyors.

During the first world war, Mr. Ure served with Royal Canadian Engineers in Halifax in 1917 and 1918. He was an active member of the St. Catharines YMCA Club as well as Memorial United Church.

He is survived by two sons, Robert A. Ure, Niagara-on-the-Lake, and Frederick A. Ure in St. Catharines. A brother Wilfred in Woodstock, and a sister Jean Ure in Woodstock, as well as four grandchildren.
