

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON BIOGRAPHY



**FREDERICK THEODORE WEBSTER, O.L.S.**

FRED T. WEBSTER was born in Ottawa, and following High School, worked with S. E. Farley, O.L.S., of Ottawa before serving with the 2nd Battalion, C.E.F. 1914-1918. Following his discharge from the army, he served his apprenticeship with J. B. Lewis at Ottawa, and was admitted to practice in 1922.

He was employed by the Department of Highways before taking over the practice of J. W. Fitzgerald at Peterborough.

In 1939 Mr. Webster enlisted in the Royal Canadian Engineers and was stationed in England with the "Survey Directorate" until 1945.

On his return to Canada he was employed as Chief Surveyor with "Housing Enterprises". He resigned this position in 1949 to go into private practice at Haliburton.

Mr. Webster died of war disabilities on August 14th, 1962, and was buried at Haliburton.
