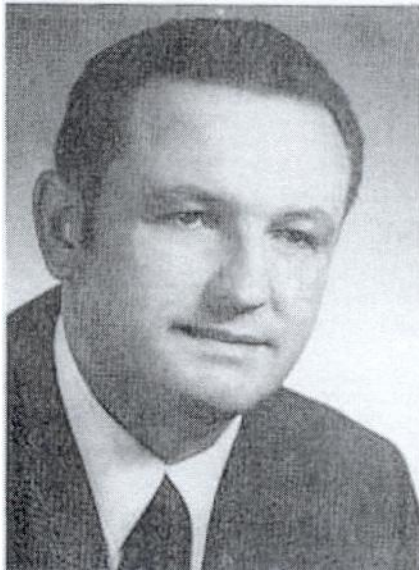


**Stanislaw Gustaw Zabek, O.L.S. – No. 1195
1929 - 2006**



Stan was born in Poland in 1929 and following completion of studies at Warsaw Polytechnic Institute where he graduated in 1958, he emigrated to Canada.

His first job in his chosen profession was as a chainman in the firm of H.L. Coons from June to November, 1959. He accepted a new position in November with Marshall Macklin Monaghan (MMM) where he subsequently articulated to Albin Tarvydas, O.L.S. and obtained his license as an Ontario Land Surveyor in 1966.

Stan spent the next 17 years with MMM where he became an Associate Partner and managed the firm's geodetic and photogrammetric survey departments. Several years were spent managing large complex international projects in such locations as Africa and the Middle East. The Nigerian project involved a consortium of MMM, Terra Surveys and Photosur.

Stan served as Chief Project Surveyor supervising 30 Canadian and over 200 Nigerian staff assisted by Paul Torrance and Glenn Smerdon. It was a four-year project, which survived three coups d'état and continued logistical problems.

In 1983 Stan left MMM to pursue other interests. He joined Public Works and Government Services Canada (PWGSC) in May of 1988 where he provided expertise in mapping and computations. He retired from PWGSC and as an Association member in 1991.

Stan passed away on June 14th 2006. He is survived by his wife of 49 years, Danuta.
